- our beloved legendary icon

Dr. Alagappa Chettiar loved the company of children, as much as he loved educating them. His daughter, Dr. Umayal Ramanathan recalls,



“His vision was that every child who enters the Alagappa campus should be able to fulfill their academic ambition. We should provide for them a wide spectrum of academic programs that they should never seek other institutions to further their education”.

Alagappa Chettiar, schooled in Karaikudi was determined to further his education and go to College, but his father who was in Malaysia wanted him to come and learn the family's money lending business. Put on a ship to Malaysia against his will, in a state of depression, a life changing moment took place when he developed high fever and the Captain thought he had typhoid and took him off the ship. Once off the ship he contacted his Uncle and begged him to tell his father to allow him to study in College. A ray of light shined on him as his father agreed. Being a class- topper he applied for admission to the top College in Madras – The Presidency College. However College had already started so he could not get admission. A determined young man that he was, he went to see the Principal and pleaded for a seat. The Principal said “Here is the rostrum of the incoming class from 1 to 40 so I am sorry there is no seat available” Immediately, displaying his presence of mind and sharp intellect he responded “Sir, zero is available”. Looking at this anxious young student the Principal could not refuse admission and said “You are a smart young boy I will

give you a seat". That was a phenomenal achievement and the start of one of the most dynamic careers of an individual who used every moment of his life to do something constructive and meaningful. While in College, he was fortunate the philosopher Dr. Radhakrishnan, who later became the President of India as his teacher. He did not fall slave to the typical fantasies of College students such as movies, parties and other entertainment. He formed the Triplicane Debating Club and got a team of like-minded students to meet in the evenings and debate world politics, economies etc. When he died at a tender age of 48 years in 1957, he revolutionized his native place of Karaikudi by buying a 1,000 acre jungle and converting it into a citadel of learning offering education from Kindergarten to post graduate education in a broad spectrum of academic curriculums. Today more than 30, 00,000 students have graduated from the various institutions that he built in Chennai and Karaikudi. The Alagappa Campus continues to grow with the Alagappa College of Nursing to be opened this year.

Why do we call him a vallal?



“Despite being religious, he was not a temple- goer nor did he donate to temples of worship. His temples were the towers of education and his donations were mainly aimed at expanding curriculums and helping the less fortunate “

While there are lots of individuals who are philanthropists and have helped the poor we still call just this single legend as a vallal. Do you know for what reason do we consider him as a vallal? It was his passion to help those in need and he continued that right through his life. All the riches that he gained through his sharp business acumen were all spent for the welfare of the community. When he died he left nothing to his only daughter but a legacy that the whole community is thankful and proud of.

Along these lines, here's a delightful incident of Alagappa Chettiar that demonstrates why we consider him as a vallal. As he got drawn into building a galaxy of educational institutions in Karaikudi single handedly, he sold one business after the other and soon started falling short of funds to build the next institution. One fine day, Alagappa Chettiar, vexed in his home at Kottaiyur debating how he would raise one lakh rupees to complete another one of his projects with only Rs. 10,000 in hand. In 1940's the sum one lakh rupees is around equivalent to one crore these days, so envision what sort of pressure he had experienced. Out of nowhere a man suddenly entered and begged him for help. He looked depressed and he told that only Alagappa can be

his saviour and narrated his story. He told that he had arranged marriage for his beloved daughter, for the arrangements, he was about to borrow ten thousand rupees from someone who agreed to offer him the money. But, unfortunately due to certain reasons that person declined to offer him the cash. So he was worried about the circumstance, and he doesn't have a clue of what to do. As compassion was a major attribute of Alagappa Chettiar he beckoned his assistant to bring the ten thousand rupees that he had and offered it to that person, telling him to organize the marriage joyfully and he also told that he'll definitely attend the marriage. The man was exuberant, cried profusely with joy, thanked Alagappa Chettiar and went on to get his daughter married. As the man left, his assistant asked Alagappa Chettiar, why did he give the only cash that he had? Alagappa Chettiar spontaneously answered that, "If I had that cash with me, I don't know whether it would solve my immediate need. But, his need was greater so I offered the cash to him. His little girl will be getting married. What's more, his whole family would be happy and cheerful".

Vallal means a person of munificence. Alagappa Chettiar's munificence was unbounded and that is why such never ending sagas of Dr. Alagappa Chettiar inspire me and demonstrates why Dr. Alagappa Chettiar alone is called a vallal.

*AN INTERVIEW WITH AN ACCOMPLISHED WOMAN IN LEADERSHIP –
DEVI ALAMELU VAIRAVAN*

Devi Alamelu Vairavan is a dynamic practicing attorney in New York, USA and trustee of the Alagappa Group of Educational Institutions in both Karaikudi and Chennai. She is a dazzling woman who has proven track record of success early on in both the US and India. Many of us know about her accomplishments and that she is also the great-granddaughter of Vallal Dr. RM Alagappa Chettiar, but beyond this is her adoring, inspiring and one of a kind personality.

What is one of her biggest goals?

Her biggest goal now is to open a law college and a medical college in Karaikudi, and enhance educational opportunities and access to it. She was always inspired by the fact that her great-grandfather became a Barrister-at-law, and believed there was tremendous value gained from learning the skills of problem solving and being an advocate regardless of whatever career is pursued. She further realized that it was her great-grandfather's dream to bring a medical college to Karaikudi and feels strongly about delivering on that dream and is prepared to do everything she can to support her father in doing it.

What is her mission in life?

Her mission in life is to follow the footsteps of her great-grandfather, just like her grandmother, Dr. Mrs. Umayal Ramanathan and just like her father, Dr. Ramanathan Vairavan and help serve as many people in need as possible. Do you see a resemblance with any of the three heroes in her family? Or is she is the mixture of the three? She describes the importance of the journey in finding life's purpose and the fact that for her, early on she watched her father, who is a global business leader, dedicate his life to helping others and doing it with such poise and empowerment that she similarly knows that is her path.

How did she succeed in another country as a young Indian woman?

With a smile she replied that, "I succeeded anywhere I went because of the values my parents instilled in me, and the fact that I was driven by my passion. I knew I had to work hard, be a good person, care about the work I do and be confident in order to succeed."

Did she ever face resistance while leading men?

Yes! But she acknowledged not to worry and that this is the time to feel proud and optimistic about being a woman. The culture and standards are changing, but it's still up to us to ensure the enforcement of our equality and respect. Together we can continue to create a culture where voices are heard and we are respected. She described how this a continuing issue facing women, and one that she faced even more so early on in her career. She said "make sure you do not get discouraged when there is push back with your leadership or involvement, or if you do not gain immediate respect as a woman; that is the time to continue to make your presence known and continue to make your points heard. You are your own person, and you have something to offer at the table! It is best to keep your seat at the table, focus on your point and reach a common

ground, rather than get distracted by whether you are being liked at the time. Don't be afraid to disagree with a point or bring new ideas forward, but always remember to be respectful and professional. In due time, you will see that you are in fact respected for your ethics."

How did she move forward when everyone else kept telling her that she couldn't?

She explained that she remained positive and persisted. She described how behind almost every successful person is a group of people, who have at some point in their lives said, "You will not succeed" "your idea will not work" or "you cannot do this". In fact, she described that people can tend to give a long list of reasons why you should not do something because often times they cannot fathom themselves doing it. But, she says that should not stop you and we should not internalize those words and that we should instead recognize what is constructive advice for us to better ourselves and begin taking action. The key is to keep trying and make a conscious effort to replace negative thoughts with positive ones. Your mind is a powerful tool, and believing you are powerful is being powerful. You have to trust yourself before you can convince anyone else to trust you! She says not to listen to advice that demotivates us and that we should instead surround ourselves with positivity and a supportive environment. She encourages us to also be that support system for someone else, especially friends and family.

What was her biggest strength and weakness?

Her biggest strength as a woman is that she is a good listener and problem solver. She realizes that we must take the time to be there for one another and always be respectful of each other's feelings and she takes pride in prioritizing that. Her weakness is that she can be a perfectionist and can spend too much time focusing on small details.

other. At the end of the day, each of us has a purpose in life, but by bettering ourselves we make the team of sisterhood so much stronger. Make sure other women have access to the beneficial information that you have and always remember to send positive messages to one another to empower and encourage each other. Ultimately, enjoy what you are doing in life, and make sure you are having fun. Merits :-

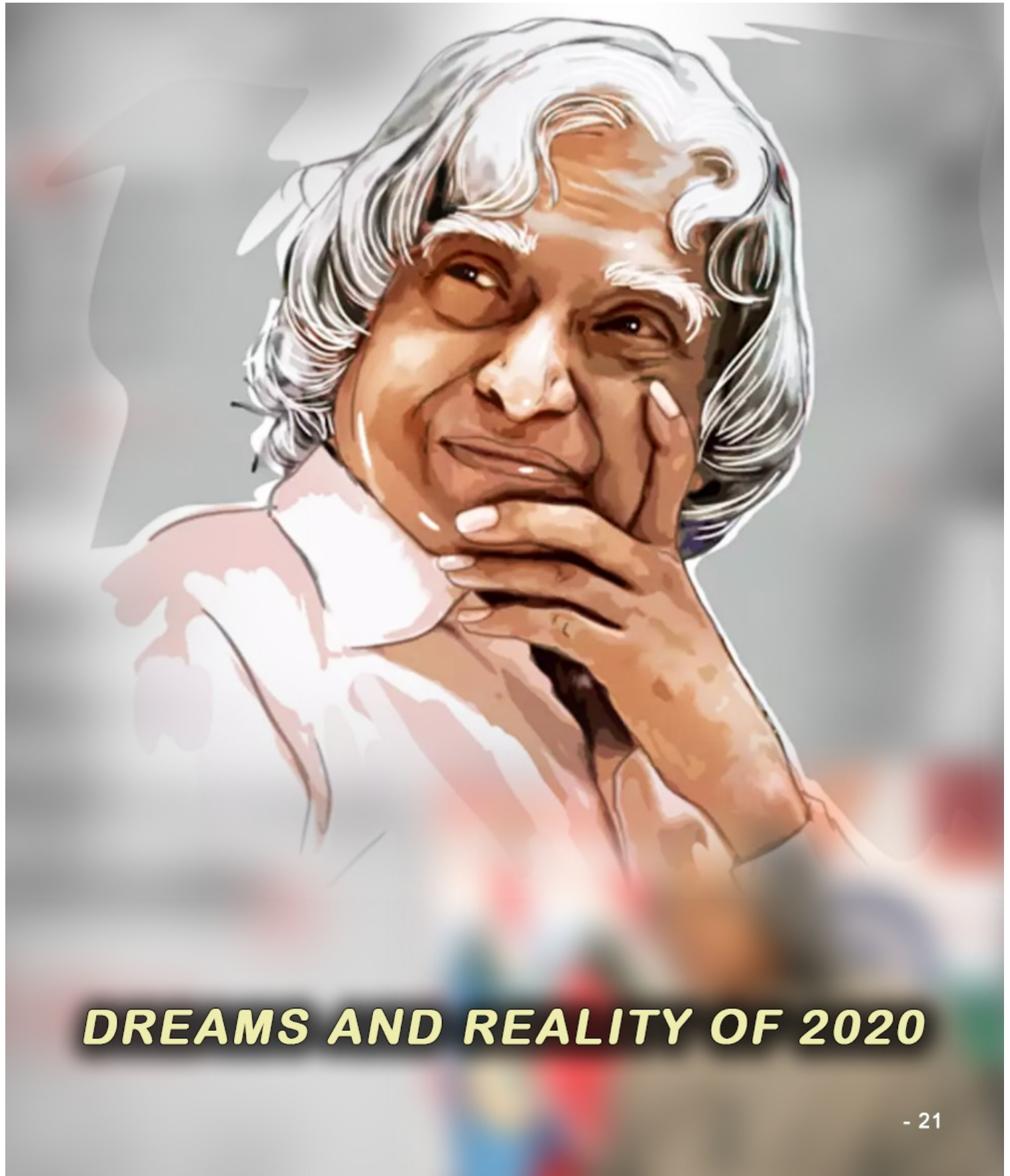

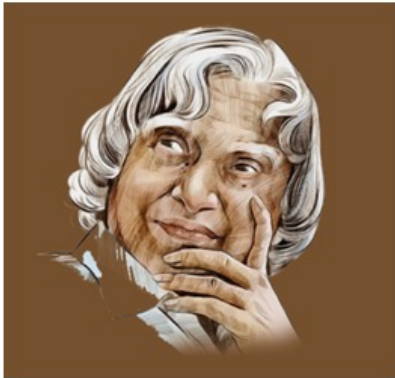

What is the deadly India - China border dispute is about?

The relationship between India and China had been worsened over the past few months and the two world powers were faced off between each other along their disputed border in the Himalayan region. other along their disputed border in the Himalayan region.

THE DEADLY CLASH IN GALWAN VALLEY:



The root cause lies in an ill-defined, 3,440km (2,100-mile)-long border that both countries dispute. Rivers, lakes and snow-caps along the frontier mean the line can shift, bringing soldiers face to face at many points, sometimes leading to confrontation. The two nations are also competing to build infrastructure along the border is the main triggers for a clash with Chinese troops in June that left at least 20 Indian soldiers dead . In August, India accused China for provoking military tensions at the border twice within a

week. In early September, China accused India for firing shots at its troops . India accused China for firing into the air. Both the countries established nuclear powers. The military tension at the border is mirrored by growing political tension, which has strained ties between Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping.

S. P. Balasubrahmanyam was one of the greatest Indian singers. He made his debut as a playback singer on 1996 with Sri Maryada Ramanna. He is not only a playback singer but also a television anchor, music director, actor, dubbing artist, and also a film producer. He worked predominantly in various languages. Even though his mother tongue was Kannada he sang more than 40,000 songs in Telugu, Tamil, Kannada, Hindi, and Malayalam. He stated that "I AM ALWAYS YOUNG BECAUSE I ALWAYS LIKE TO COMMUNICATE WITH THE CHILDREN MORE". He held the "WORLD GUINNESS RECORD" for recording the highest number of songs by a singer with more than 40,000 songs. He recorded 21 songs in Kannada on 8 February 1981. In addition, he recorded 19 songs in Tamil and 16 songs in Hindi in a day, which has also been called a record. Even it is known to all that the very popular raga "To" the very popular raga "Sankarabaranam" is being popularized only after releasing the film "Sankarabaranam" in which he sang "Om Kaara Nadhanu, a popular song in Sankarabaranam raga. His "Ragangal Padhinaru" song is very familiar because the history of ragas are beautifully compared with a Lady. The song is in the raga "Aabheri". Apart from the cine songs he also sang many carnatic songs. He sang

Lingashtakam, and many more devotional songs like “Hara harashivane”. He won six National Film Awards for Best Male Playback Singer for his works in four different languages: Telugu, Tamil, Kannada, and Hindi. He won six film fare awards south. In 2012, he received the state NTR National Award for his contributions to the Indian cinema. In 2016, he was honoured with the Silver Peacock Medal as Indian Film Personality of the Year. He was a recipient of the Padma Shri (2001) and Padma Bhushan (2011) from the Government of India. Even he didn't know Carnatic music much but still he created a history. Genetically Modified Seeds

A green planet is a happy clean planet!



In the current kharif season, farmers would undertake mass sowing of GM seeds for maize, soya bean, mustard, brinjal and herbicide tolerant (Ht) cotton, although these are not approved farmers carried out a similar movement last year, too.

Conventional plant breeding involves crossing species of the same genus to provide the offspring with the desired traits of both parents. Genetic engineering aims to transcend the genus barrier by introducing an alien gene in the seeds to get the desired effects. The alien gene could be from a plant, an animal or even a soil bacterium.

But cotton, the only GM crop that is allowed in India, has two alien genes from the soil bacterium *Bacillus thuringiensis* (Bt) that allows the crop to develop a protein toxic to the common pest pink bollworm. HtBt, on the

cotton is derived with the insertion of an additional gene, from another soil bacterium, which allows the plant to resist the common herbicide glyphosate. In India, the Genetic Engineering Appraisal Committee (GEAC) is the apex body that allows for commercial release of GM crops. In 2002, the GEAC had allowed the commercial release of Bt cotton. More than 95 per cent of the country's cotton area has since then come under Bt cotton. Use of the unapproved GM variant can attract a jail term of 5 years and fine of Rs. 1 lakh under the Environmental Protection Act, 1989.

In the case of cotton, farmers cite the high cost of weeding, which goes down considerably if they grow HtBt cotton and use glyphosate against weeds. Brinjal growers in Haryana have rooted for Bt brinjal as it reduces the cost of production by cutting down on the use of pesticides.

Unauthorized crops are widely used were as Industry estimate says that of the 4-4.5 crore packets (each weighing 400 gm) of cotton sold in the country out of which 50 lakh are unapproved HtBt cotton.

Haryana has reported farmers growing Btbrinjal in pockets which had caused a major agitation there. In June last year, in a movement led by ShetkariSanghatana in Akola district of Maharashtra, more than 1,000 farmers defied the government and sowed HtBt cotton. The Akola district authorities subsequently booked the organizers.

Environmentalists argue that the long-lasting effect of GM crops is yet to be studied and thus they should not be released commercially. Genetic modification, they say, brings about changes that can be harmful to humans in the long run.

The Sanghatana has announced that this year they are going to undertake large-scale sowing of unapproved GM crops like maize, HtBt cotton, soybean and brinjal across Maharashtra. Farmers who plant such variants will put up boards on their fields proclaiming the GM nature of their crop. Anil Ghanwat, president of the union, has said this action will draw attention to the need for introduction of the latest technology in the fields. He said farmers will not be deterred by any action taken against them by the authorities.

Finally, if insects are dying then that is the same case for us.

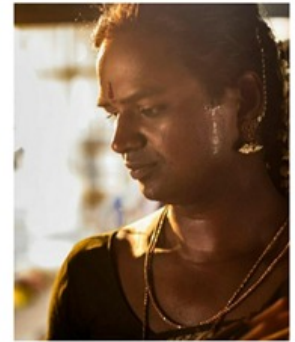

Nowadays, people suffer from Anger. Here are some tips to manage your anger:

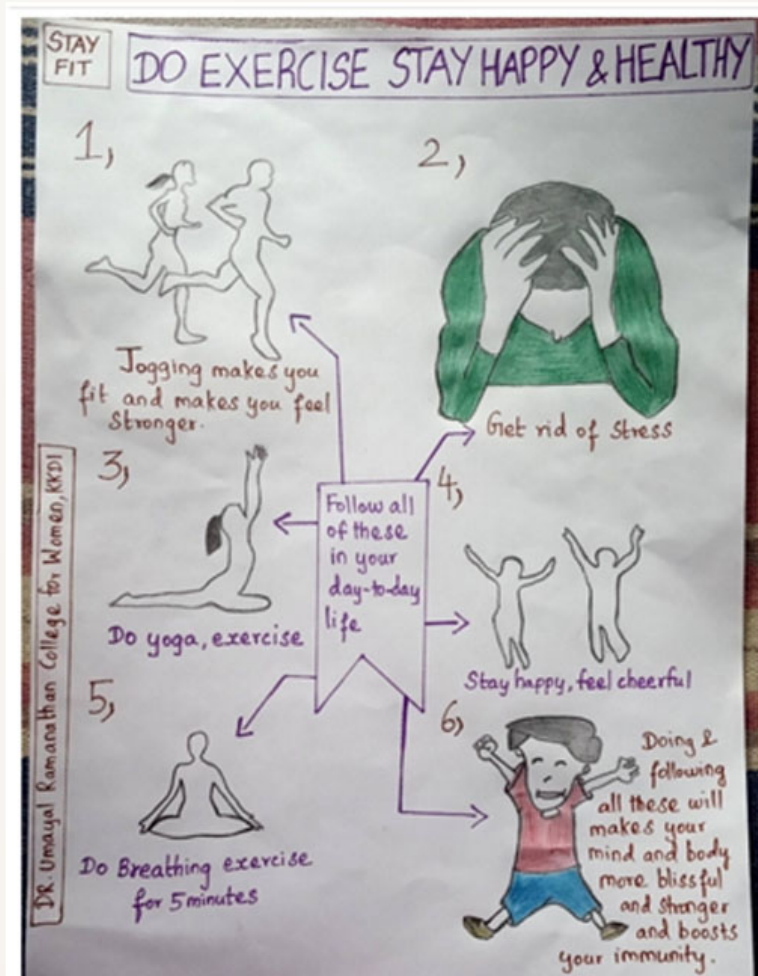


- In the heat of the moment, it's easy to say something you will later regret. Take a few moments to collect your thoughts before saying anything and allow others involved in the situation to do the same.

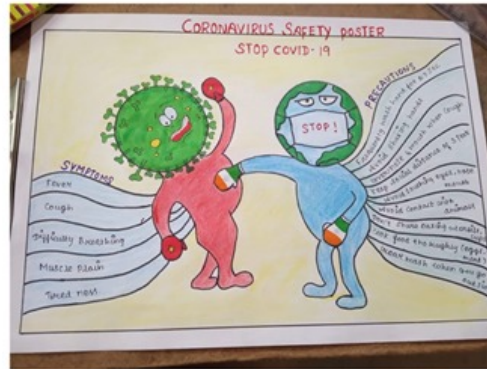
